A resolution of the Juneau Chamber of Commerce Safety and Security for the Downtown Business District

JCC 2017- 01

Whereas, the Juneau Chamber of Commerce has a primary mission to support economic diversity, encourage entrepreneurship, and maintain Juneau's high quality of life; and

Whereas, the Juneau Chamber of Commerce has a responsibility to serve, protect and promote, local business; and

Whereas, the Juneau Chamber of Commerce has an overriding objective to improve the business climate and make this community a more desirable place to work, live and shop; and

Whereas, conditions have developed in the downtown business district that have created an unsafe environment for employees and patrons of businesses and residents of downtown apartments to work and live; and

Whereas, the Downtown Business Association and many concerned business owners have sought a workable resolution to address the safety issues; and

Whereas, the CBJ has put forth CBJ Resolution 2016-44 relating to *Camping in the downtown business district*;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Greater Juneau Chamber of Commerce encourages the City & Borough of Juneau Assembly to pass resolution 2016-44 as a necessary step in addressing the concerns of Juneau's citizens to work toward improving the safety for all who work, live and shop in downtown Juneau; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Greater Juneau Chamber of Commerce encourages the City & Borough of Juneau Assembly to work with community stakeholders to develop long-term solutions to address the well-being of those who may be displaced by this ordinance.
